Plant List

Hogweed - Heracleum sphondylium

Alexanders - Smyrnium olusatrum

Rosy Garlic - Allium roseum

Neapolitan Garlic - Allium neapolitanum (like A. roseum a Mediterranean species, casual in mainly southern UK, as an escape or throw-out)

Smooth Meadow Grass - Poa pratensis

Perennial Rye Grass - Lolium perenne

Yorkshire Fog - Holcus lanatus

False Oat Grass - Arrhenatherum elatius

Southern Marsh Orchid - Dactylorhiza praetermissa

Pyramidal Orchid - Anacamptis pyramidalis

Sessile Oak - Quercus petraea (not sure, could be hybrid as so many are, apparently)

Eyebright - Euphrasia rostkoviana (I made this E. tetraquetra, with a typical churchtower inflorescence, i.e. on all four sides of the stem, as it were)

Lady's Bedstraw - Galium verum

Sweet Vernal Grass - Anthoxanthum odoratum

Mouse-ear Hawkweed - Hieracium pilosella (this is what I called the lemon-yellow one, with lovely greyish, long-hairy leaves on the runners looking somewhat reminiscent of a mouse's ears)

Red Fescue - Festuca cf. rubra (probably but not scrutinised closely. In this case I'd record it as Festuca cf. rubra, signifying it's a Fescue looking like — and therefore referred to — rubra but not examined in enough detail to confirm)

Sea Bindweed - Calystegia soldanella

Sand Couch - Agropyron junceiforme

Common Knapweed - Centaurea nigra

Yellow Vetch - Vicia lutea (I think I went astray here as it was Meadow Vetchling - Lathyrus pratensis — which I've just noticed below)

Cat's-ear - Hypochaeris radicata (Another yellow composite, identified by its leaf-tip. It only has rosette leaves)

Cornish/Western Fumitory - Fumaria occidentalis (native only to Cornwall and Scilly)

Meadow Vetchling - Lathyrus pratensis

Meadow Clary - Salvia pratensis

Black Mustard - Brassica nigra

Yellow Rattle - Rhinanthus minor

Smooth Hawkweed - Crepis capillaris

Small Rest-harrow - Ononis reclinata (Common Restharrow - O. repens. Our plants were small but O. reclinata looks different and is rare on limestone, etc.)

Hemp-agrimony - Eupatorium cannabinum

Rubus riddelsdellii - Riddelsdell's Bramble

Field Scabious - Knautia arvensis

Crested Dog,s-tail - Cynosurus cristatus

Yellow Oat-grass - Trisetum flavescens

South-western Bramble - Rubus ramosus

Germander Speedwell - Veronica chamaedrys

White Stonecrop - Sedum album

Green Alkanet - Pentaglottis sempervirens

Field Forget-me-not - Myosotis arvensis (Probably right but I take ages to get these right, so best Myosotis cf. arvensis)

Pink Oxalis - Oxalis articulata

Dewberry - Rubus caesius

Yarrow - Achillea millefolium

Kidney Vetch - Anthyllis vulneraria

Purple Fumitory - Fumaria purpurea (a Red Data species, much more widely distributed in the UK but more threatened)

Wild Mignonette - Reseda alba

Dove's- foot Crane's-bill - Geranium molly

Sand Sedge - Carex arenaria

Salsify - Tragopogon porrifolius

Salad Burnet - Sanguisorba minor

Common Bird's- foot Trefoil - Lotus corniculatus

Marram Grass - Ammophila arenaria

Black Medick - Medicago lupulina

Spurge - Euphorbia paralias or E. portlandica

Wild Privet - Ligustrum vulgare

Common Stork,s-bill - Erodium cicutarium

Ivy Broomrape - Orobanche hederae

Wild Madder - Rubia peregrina

Coltsfoot - Tussilago farfara (Yellow composite, identified by the leaves)

Grey Willow - Salix cinerea subsp. oleifolia (also known as Sallow)

Sea Beet - Beta vulgaris subsp. maritima

Sea Plantain - Plantago maritima

Thrift, Sea Pink - Armeria maritima

Rock Samphire - Crithmum maritimum

Common Scurvy-grass - Cochlearia officinalis

Maidenhair Fern - Adiantum capillus-veneris (found in a Swallow cave and on an unusual series of habitats caused by lime-rich sand forming a layer of plaster on rocks and vegetation as it is washed from the dunes)

Small-leaved Cotoneaster - Cotoneaster microphyllus

Common Horsetail - Equisetum arvense

Groundsel - Senecio vulgaris (Yellow composite)

Wild Carrot - Daucus carota

Prickly Sow-thistle - Sonchus asper

Smooth Sow-thistle - Sonchus oleraceus (Two more yellow composites. I'm sure we saw both)

Bittersweet - Solanum dulcamara

Travellers Joy - Clematis vitiable

A Horsetail - Equisetum sp.
